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REGULATION (Euratom) No 944/89 OF THE COMMISSION

of 12 April 1989

laying down maximum permitted levels of radioactive contamination in minor foodstuffs following a nuclear accident or any other radiological emergency

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN

COMMUNITIES -

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Atomic Energy Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (Euratom) No 3954/87 of 22 December 1987 laying down maximum permitted levels of radioactive contamination of foodstuffs and feedingstuffs following a nuclear accident or any other radiological emergency (1), and in particular Article 7,

Whereas:

According to Regulation (Euratom) No 3954/87, the Commission a list of minor foodstuffs together with the established maximum limits applicable to these foods.

This is in accordance with Article 31 of the Euratom Treaty by the Committee for Scientific and Technical Expert Group has been consulted.

Food in question are those of minor dietary importance, representing a small percentage of food consumption by the population.

The information included in the list of foods of lesser importance included foods based on their code numbers in the combined nomenclature and description set out in Regulation (EEC) No 3174/88 of 21 to September 1988 amending Annex I to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2658/87 on the tariff and statistical nomenclature and on the Common Customs Tariff (2) mark.

The 3954/87 by Regulation (Euratom) No other ad-hoc committee has not within the time limit set by its chairman position -

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The 3954/87 under Article 7 of Regulation (Euratom) No-defined list of minor foodstuffs is given in the appendix.

Article 2

Maximum values for the foods listed in the Annex of lesser importance are ten times higher than those for "Other foodstuffs except minor foodstuffs" in the Annex to Regulation (Euratom) No 3954/87 and in accordance with the provisions of regulations under adopted by Article 3 of that Regulation, are set.

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
